## Recordings

You are responsible for making a recording of you performing all three of your State Competition pieces. Each piece must be one continuous recording no stops (unless for written rests). Your recording must be made at home today/tonight and not at school.

## This will count as your test grade and participation grade.

## How to record:

1.Turn the power ON. Slide the $0 / I$ switch on the left side of the unit toward $0 / I$ until the unit turns on. Release.

2. Place the recorder 2-6 feet away from you on a flat table, chair, or stand. It must be flat with the two microphones on top of the unit facing you.
3. Press the REC key to start recording. The REC indicator lights up red during recording.

(DO NOT MAKE ANY ADJUSTMENTS TO THE UNIT OR THE SETTINGS - IT IS SET UP PROPERY)
4. SPEAK:

Your Name
The piece you are playing
5. Play the piece - no stops unless written in the music.
6. Press the STOP key to stop recording.
7. If you want to listen what you recorded Press the PLAY key to playback the recording. (you can listen to your recording using headphones or the internal speaker)
8. Repeat steps 3 through 6 for each piece.
9. Turn the power OFF. Slide the $0 / \mathrm{I}$ switch on the left side of the unit toward $0 / \mathrm{I}$ until the unit turns OFF. Release.
10. Print your name and recorder number (MT_) on each page of your music.

## 11. Turn your music and recorder in by 8am tomorrow.

## Rules:

1. Failure to turn your music and recording in by 8 am will result in a letter grade drop on this test and your participation grade every 60 minutes it is late.
2. Failure to make your recording will result in a zero on this test and zero on your participation. You will get a recorder everyday until it is completed
3. Your recording must be made at home - NOT AT SCHOOL.
4. Take this serious - this is a class just like any other - treat it that way.

## Responsibility:

1. By accepting the recorder you are responsible for it. If you damage it, lose it, or it is stolen while in your possession, you are responsible for $\$ 120$ for its replacement.
2.You are responsible for practicing 30 minutes everyday. If you have - this will be an easy test and should only take 20 minutes.
2. These are not toys. Recording anything else other than your test - it will adversely affect your grade.
